### Tuition Fees

Contributions are differentiated in relation to economic conditions, from a minimum of € 400 to a maximum of € 1,783 (if you comply with set time).

### Benefits

**Top 10 Student Program** is a merit based recognition giving total or partial exemption from comprehensive contribution to up to 10% of students enrolled in three-year degrees, master courses and single cycle masters reaching given profit requisites. The Right to education service office is in charge of singling out the students who will benefit from exemption and there is no need to present an application.

### Enrollment

**Study VISA Application** - After being selected as eligible candidates, prospective students are required to pre-enroll and apply for a VISA at the Italian Representative in their Country.

# Clinical Psychology for Individuals, Families and Organizations

## Objectives

The purpose of the Degree is to prepare a new professional psychologist who is capable of dealing not only with the personal problems of individuals, couples and families, but also with work-related problems, their development in enterprises, institutions and non-profit organizations.

Aside from lectures, courses are characterized by active learning through exercises, role plays and group work. Moreover, a curricular traineeship is provided.

Students will be given the tools to work in macro-social contexts, to promote a satisfactory balance between the needs of individual empowerment and business objectives, taking into account the sustainable development of business in both national and international contexts.

In particular, they will receive adequate preparation to carrying out a selection of personnel, "team" and "one to one" coaching in companies, institutions and non-profit organizations, to handle issues related to the management of the decision-making process, of communication and of the social skills of organizations and institutions.

Students will also learn to design preventive interventions aimed not only at individuals, couples and families but also at companies, institutions and non-profit organizations.

## Admission requirements

A Bachelor Degree and 88 credits in the Psychology area are required as well as evidence of a medium-high level of proficiency in English (level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).
